

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S MENTAL HEALTH

Children may find it easier to enjoy learning, stay motivated, and deal with challenges when they have your support. Here's some tips to help your child during times of change and uncertainty.

Help them build strong relationships - Having at least one trusted person they know that they can talk to will help in times of need. Here are some activities that can be used at home or in the classroom to encourage students to seek support:

- Listen and communicate Mealtimes are often a good time for talking. Ask questions about your child's day and give them time to respond.
- Solve problems together Work together with your child to identify a challenge and discuss what steps you can take to reduce stress. Consider trying a breathing exercise!
- Provide time and support your children to be active every day This can be structured activities or can be time to play together and with others. Best to have a combination of both if possible.
- Help your children get enough sleep Follow a regular schedule, shut off screens at least 1 hour before bedtime and encourage calm activities right before bed.

STUDENT DISMISSAL & EARLY PICKUP

We continue to have a structured dismissal process that supports student safety at a very busy time of the day. We begin the dismissal process at 3:46pm by escorting primary students to the buses. All other students are dismissed at 3:50pm.

A few things about early dismissal:

- We cannot call a student down for early pick-up after 3:30pm.
- If you require early pick-up, please inform the office before 3:15. Pick-up is at the front door only.
- Regular pick-up will occur at 3:50pm. For safety, PLEASE HAVE ID READY
- Walkers will be dismissed at the 3:50 bell

PERSONAL DEVICES - cell phones/smartphones

Personal technology is a reality. With the increase in cell phone usage, we see an increase in cyberbullying and inappropriate use of technology. In elementary school, students are learning how to manage safety and etiquette while online. Teachers work with students around internet safety, and are committed to keeping your child safe. The following policy is in place and aligns with KPRDSB's appropriate use of technology policy.

Personal devices are not required at school. We have enough student technology (Chromebooks, iPads, and desktop computers) to offer your children a technology rich learning experience.

If your child brings a cell phone or smartphone to school, the following expectations are in place:

- 1. The device is stored away for the entire day when on school property unless a staff member has provided a specific educational task to complete under their direct supervision.
- 2. If a child misuses technology we implement the following progressive discipline approach:
- First Offense: Verbal warning
- **Second Offense**: A second verbal warning is given with clear explanation of consequence if expectations are not followed.
- Third Offense: The student will be asked to bring their device to the office where the principal will discuss the policy with them and provide a warning of the potential loss of privileges.
- Fourth Offense: Device will no longer be allowed at school and a phone call home will be made.

Students may use their devices on the bus, but cannot be turned on until they are seated. If you need to contact your child during the school day, please call the office directly. We will call your child to the office.

REGISTERING FOR EDSBY

Edsby is a major form of communication between the school and home. Both the classroom and the office have access to messaging through EDSBY and most of your child's school information (i.e., OEN number and report cards) can be accessed through this site.
